A Discussion of the *Stop the Beach Renourishment v. Florida DEP* Case and Other Coastal Takings Issues



James S. Burling, Esq., Director of LitigationPacific Legal Foundation, Sacramento

Mr. Burling has been with Pacific Legal Foundation since 1983. His cases involve regulatory takings, environmental and land use regulations, eminent domain, and Indian law. In 2001, he successfully argued a leading property rights case, *Palazzolo v. Rhode Island*, before the U.S. Supreme Court. He is a frequent lecturer at continuing legal education courses on topics such as the regulation of wetlands, eminent domain and the "taking" of private property. He is also the Chairman of the Federalist Society's Environmental Law and Property Rights Practice Group.



Martha M. Collins, Esq. Collins Law Group, Tampa

Ms. Collins is the founder of Collins Law Group, where she has successfully litigated, lobbied, and negotiated for many of Florida's largest precedent-setting environmental and land use cases and policies. She has appeared before numerous governmental agencies in Florida and Washington, DC, including, the Florida Governor, Cabinet and Legislature, and members of the U.S Congress. Her work has been quoted or referenced in the *New York Times*, the *Washington Post*, *Forbes*, *Politico*, *National* and *Florida Public Radio*, and newspapers across the country and world. Ms. Collins is Vice Chair for the Environmental and Land Use Section of the Florida Bar.



Scott D. Makar, Esq., Solicitor General Office of the Attorney General, Tallahassee

Mr. Makar has been Solicitor General for the State of Florida since February 2007. The position, first established in February 1999, is patterned in part after the U.S. Office of the Solicitor General, which conducts litigation on behalf of the United States in the U.S. Supreme Court and supervises the handling of litigation in federal appellate courts. Florida's Solicitor General serves three primary roles: overseeing civil appeals involving the State's interests in all state and federal appellate courts as well as all appeals in the U.S. Supreme Court; teaching at the Florida State University College of Law; and serving as a legal policy advisor to the Attorney General.



Gary Oldehoff, Esq. Lewis, Stroud & Deutsch, Boca Raton

Mr. Oldehoff concentrates his practice on complex litigation, land use and development law, constitutional law, civil rights law, employment law, and appellate law, with an emphasis on local government representation.
